What	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This Dance & Cultural Camp will immerse young people in their culture. • Participants will work with regional Aboriginal dance facilitators to learn the new Saltwater Freshwater Dance. • They will also learn cultural practices like weaving, didgeridoo, bush tucker, visual art • The camp will be visited by local Elders and cultural leaders
Outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Participants will perform for family and community on the Friday of the camp and have a shared bush tucker lunch • Participants will have the opportunity to perform in '(Our) Flash Mob', a dance group that will perform flash mobs in locations around the region during NAIDOC week. • Participants will have the opportunity to perform at the Saltwater Freshwater Festival in Coffs Harbour in January 2015.
